

ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE SESSION 2016-17

Sankaradeva Mahavidyalaya, Pathalipahar.

College Background:

Sankaradeva Mahavidyalaya was established at Pathalipahar in the year 1982 by the efforts of local inhabitants who felt the urgency of an institution of higher education in the locality. Pathalipahar, a rural tribal sub-plan area, is located at the border of Assam and Arunachal Pradesh as a centre of integration. In spite of utter backwardness of the area and poverty of its people, this college has been striving towards advancement and progress in all directions since its inception. The college has Arts Stream only and imparting higher education in nine subjects of Social Science and Humanities to the poor and needy students for whom higher education is a dream and beyond reach. Our college is permanently affiliated to Dibrugarh University and we have already done a lot by the assistance of UGC and other sources.

We have built a well furnished library, a congenial reading room and preserving a good number of books and journals. The teachers as well as the students can satisfy their thirst of knowledge using the library which is full of various types of book and current journals.

The college has an “Information and Career Guidance Cell” (ICGC) to provide information to the students about different courses, admission procedures, supply formats and advertisement of jobs in various sectors. The college has established two separate centres for specialized study, research and development of folk-art, oral-tradition, culture and preservation of age-old religious scriptures. These two centers are Sankaradeva Study and Research Centre and Tribal Development Centre.

The college has a band of young, energetic and enthusiastic teachers who are actively participative in both academic and community oriented activities. That is why we have already organized National Seminar/Workshop and number of National environmental awareness campaigns, AIDS awareness campaigns, Medical camps etc. college is a member of Sydney based International NGO “Clean-up the World”. The college had applied voluntarily to NAAC for Assessment and Accreditation. The NAAC Peer team visited the college and made through supervision on the basis of SSR prepared by the college. After being satisfied, the

NAAC awarded “B” Grade to us, which is another milestone in the history of this rural college with limited resource.

1. Organizing Workshop on Career Counseling:

Several workshop and seminars are organized for the betterment of the college students. Career counseling and entrepreneurship development were given topmost priority for the entry into services of the students. On 12th Augst’2016 a workshop on career management was organized by ICGC in collaboration with Life Insurance Co-operation of India, Lakimpur Branch. Three resource persons namely, Gitali Dowarah Circle Officer (ACS) Bihpuria, Md. A. Anchari, Senior Branch Manager, LIC, Lakhimpur Branch and Mr. B.P. Nath, LIC, Branch Manager, Bihpuria Branch have conducted the workshop as resource person. The workshop was inaugurated by Dr. Mahendra Bora, Principal, Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya. About 205 students participated in the workshop.

2. Organizing Workshop on entrepreneurship development:

On 18th Feb'2017 the ICGC of our college organized one workshop on career development and entry into services through entrepreneurship development. In the workshop nearly 130 students and all the faculty members participated in the workshop. The workshop was inaugurated by Dr. Mahendra Bora, Principal, Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya and two resource persons namely Ms. Chandrima, CEO, Sun Beam Inc. Kolkata and Mr. Sankar Chawdhury, Senior Faculty Member of the same Inco-operation, took part in the workshop and the students were given some scientific tricks and tactics to manage the stress during competitive and college examination. Mostly the students were highly benefited during the interactive session.

3. Development of the College Outdoor Stadium:

The UGC has sanctioned an amount of Rs. 60,00,000.00 (Sixty Lakhs) only for the construction of outdoor stadium with 8 running tracks. Out of the total grants, Rs. 30,00,000.00 (Thirty Lakhs) only has been received by the college. The fund has been properly utilized and expert committee consists of Vice Chancellor from Bidya Bharati, Kolkatta, Director of College development council Dibrugarh University, University Engineer and Director of Sports of Dibrugarh University inspected our outdoor stadium and submitted the report to the UGC North Eastern Regional Office for sanctioning the remaining part of the grant. The project is supposed to be completed within this year. The college normally uses the play field of Pathalipahar "Anchalik Unnayan Sewa Samitee" which is situated at Pathalipahar. But now student as well as the local sports persons will be benefited after completion of the outdoor stadium.

4. Installation of strong Wi-Fi facilities for office and students:

The Bharat Sangser Nigam Limited (BSNL) installed Wi-Max machine for internet system in the college. But due to technical difficulties from the side of the BSNL, the college authority could not properly use the Wi-Max system. So, Jio Wi-Fi is successfully installed in Principals' Room, Library Reading Room and in student's common room. All the teachers and students now can use the Jio Wi-Fi easily.

5. Construction of vehicle parking shed:

Keeping the vehicles in the college campus is a great problem for the college authority, therefore the college authority proposed to construct a two lane vehicle parking in the college campus adjacent to the shooting range. But due to paucity of fund the college authority could not construct the vehicle parking shed. Of course, insufficient of land is one of the constraint to construct the vehicle shed.

6. Organizing the Lecture Series:

Sankardeva Study and Research Centre has organized the first lecture series on 21.02.2017. The Lecture series was on "Sankardeva's life, philosophy and writings". Three resource persons namely, prof. Khagendra Nath Talukdar (Rtd. Prof. Pub Kamrup College, Bihata Chariali), Dr. Utpal Saikia (Asstt. Prof. of Kalabari College) and Mr khagendra Nath Bora of Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya have delivered their respective lecture and submitted their research papers. The lecture was presided by Mr. Tagar Neog chairman governing Body of Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya and inaugurated by Dr. Mahendra Bora, Principal Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya. Nearby 150 students and 25 guardians have participated the lecture. Another two series of lectures have been proposed in the session 2017-18.

7. Extension of Library Room:

As the Library Books and Journals have been increasing day by day it become very problematic to keeps the books in proper stack. Therefore, the adjacent Economics Department, having carpet area of 7,44 sqft. has been shifted to newly construct double storied building and the previous economics department has been re-constructed as stock room for library books.

8. Adaptation of a Nearby under Developed Village:

A village namely, Pthalipahar Majulial Gaon which is situated within a radius of 1 Km. from our college. The village is down trodden one, so we have decided to adopt the village for all round development. We had a discussion with the local MLA and the local people in a general meeting held on Rupjyoti ME School and the MLA has given the assurance to develop the infrastructure

facilities of the lower primary school of the village, and he consented to repair the approach road from railway crossing to the village in a phase manner.

As per our preliminary survey of the Pthalipahar Majulial Gaon in 2016-17, the population pattern and infrastructural facilities are mentioned herewith: The total population of the village is 333 out of which male population is 170 and female is 163. The total numbers of households is 69 only.

The literacy rate of the village is about 80%. The village has one Middle and one Lower Primary school, the inhabitants of the village is mainly Assamese and Nepali. Some of the villagers established mini tea garden and Vermi composed plants. For marketing the villagers generally moves to Pthalipahar and Banderdewa. The primary occupation of the villagers is agriculture.

Part B:

3. The college authority has accepted total six numbers of well defined goals for the all round development of the college together with the local people of the catchments area.
 - In the beginning of the session, as the University of Dibrugarh introduced the Semester Course in the colleges, so to make the students aware of the course and to make efficient the principal takes personal initiative to counseling the student in their respective classes.
 - To bring the importance of social harmony, integration and enhancement in overall socio-cultural aspects of the students, the college arranged cultural workshops on classical (Satriya) songs and dance in association with Sankaradeva Study and Research Centre. The workshop is opened for college students and youth of the local area.
 - To create the awareness among the students about the glorious past of human history and wealth, the college arranged to teach the student

community in association with the department of history and Natya Charcha(Drama Section) by organizing group discussion and workshops.

- To create awareness about the environmental degradation and digester management, the college adopted the scheme of Plantation and also teaches the students through the Environmental Studies Course, which is a compulsory subject in degree classes.
- Organization of counseling programme with the District and Local administrative officer, where the local people and ex-students are also entangled.
- Socio-economic survey of local backward villages to know their socio-economic aspects, under “Think and Work Together” Scheme.

4. New academic programme initiated (UG and PG):

As per the new guideline from UGC and Dibrugarh University, every college of the Dibrugarh University has been instructed to introduce Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) from academic session of 2017. On September 2016 the Co-ordinator IQAC attended a workshop on introduction of “CBCS” in Dibrugarh University. In the first part of the 2017, two other workshops regarding “CBCS” were held in LTK College, Lakhimpur and Madhabdev College, Narayanpur. Almost all the faculty members have attended the workshop.

The college has obtained permission to open a Study Centre of Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University and continued the both PG and Degree courses till today. Moreover, examination centre for National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) has been introduced as per request from MHRD, New Delhi. The examination is held biannually (i.e. on May-June and Oct.-Nov). Which is continuing till date.

5. Inter-disciplinary programme:

The Class routine of the college is designed in such a way that one teacher from every department has to deliver lecture on multidisciplinary course. Moreover the common classes such as some parts statistics and Indian Literature etc. are taken by teachers from different departments. The college has launched Inter-disciplinary programme in collaboration with Sankaradeva Study and Research Centre and Tribal Development Centre respectively. Through Sankaradeva Study and Research Centre, students are involved to learn classical songs, dance and drama and to learn the old manuscripts (Sauchipat).

Through the Tribal development centre (TDC). Socio-economic survey programme is conducted in time to time. Moreover inter-disciplinary classes are organized in between various related departments, whenever the authority feels it necessary.

6. Examination reforms implemented:

From the beginning of the semester courses, the Semester examinations are held as per the programme of Dibrugarh University. The Semester Monitoring Committee of the college arranges sessional Examinations time to time. Major Test Examinations and Unit test are conducted under the departmental supervision.

A Spot Evaluation Zone of Dibrugarh University has been entrusted to our college for last four years. Two assistant zonal officers are appointed to conduct the zone smoothly. Almost 15 to 20 thousand scripts are evaluated in our college zone sincerely. Nearly 50 teachers from the different colleges are appointed as Examiner/Scrutinizer/ Head Examiner for zonal spot evaluation. The Principal of our college act as a zonal officer.

8. Initiative towards faculty development programme.

The authority generally encourages the faculty members to participate in orientation/refresher courses, seminars, workshops and various research related works .A discussion on “Choice Based Credit System” was held in the teachers unit meeting and our principal Dr.M.Borah has elaborately explained the various issues regarding CBCS and all the faculty members actively participated the same. Moreover, most of the faculty members has participated one workshop on CBCS in Madhavdev College, Narianpur in January 2017. In the year 2016 the coordinator of ISMC/IQAC Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya has attended one workshop on CBCS in Dibrugarh University. Some of the faculty members have also attended a workshop on CBCS in LTK College, Azad, Lakhimpur in nov 2016.

20. Community Services:

a) NSS (National Social Service Scheme) Camp:-

The College has an NSS wing with more than 100 numbers of volunteers and it is recognized by Dibrugarh University. In this session the NSS wings of the college, under the guidance of NSS programme officer Mr. Brojen Saikia undertook a cleanup camp from 24th march to 25th march 2017 at Rupjuti ME school, Pthalipahar Majulial Gaon. All total 30 students participated in the clean up camp, out of 30 students, 17 were boys & 13 were girls students. In those two days camp, the volunteers cleaned the school camps and they constructed a new approach road to the school and bamboo fencing was made to cover the boundary of the school. More over they conducted an awareness programme on common diseases and its remedies. Dr. Umaram Tamuli participated as a resource person in the discussion on the topic "common diseases and its remedies". On the last day a cultural show was performed by the volunteers in front of the villagers and school students. The local people of the village also actively took part in the cultural programme.

b) Counseling:-

As per the instruction of Dibrugarh University, the principal takes personal initiative to counseling the student in their respective classes, to make them aware of the course and to make efficient. Principal generally takes six to seven counseling classes through out the session. Several workshops have been done so for carrier management of the students.

25. Course in which students assessment of teachers is introduced and the action taken on students feedback:

Students are entrusted the task of evaluation through college XYZ formats of their teachers, existing course, library, infrastructure facilities, etc. It is said that students are the best judge of their teachers. After final feedback report, the Principal personally interact with the teachers who get low grade and asked them to rectify their drawbacks.

Students Assessment of course contents is seriously taken. A few rectifications pointed out by the students are sent to Dibrugarh University by the Principal.

The experience of outgoing students is quite important. So, feedback of outgoing students is always regarded as valuable for college. Teachers, course content and overall academic environment are the subject matters to be commented by the outgoing students. Those evaluations are taken seriously by the authority and undertake adequate steps for overall uplift.

26. Unit cost of education:

27. Computerization of administration and the process of admission and examinations, results, issue of certificates:

Administration and the process of admission, examinations, results, issue of certificates have been computerized. Moreover the process of digitalization of central library has been upgraded with Soul.02 version. The process of full digitalization of library is expected to be completed within the end of this year.

The entire process of examinations is conducted by Dibrugarh University. Only sessional and test examination are conducted by the college itself.

28. Increase in infrastructural facilities:

- i. A college canteen is temporally constructed in the beginning of the academic session for the refreshment purpose to students and faculty members of our college. The canteen consists of two rooms measuring 42x20 sq ft and 14X20 sq ft, for refreshment and catering room respectively. The canteen is likely to be permanent as and when fund will be available.
- ii. The construction of outdoor stadium is in progress, the boundary wall of three sides has already been completed so far along with three numbers of galleries. We have completed 140 mtrs X 120 mtrs track field and remaining part of the field will be completed within the last part of 2017, for which, second installment from UGC has already been received.

29. Technology up gradation:

B). Photo cum Thumb bio-matrix has been re-introduced in the college for teachers and employees to ensure working hours.

30. Computer and internet access and training to teachers and students:

So far our College has installed three jio-modem having Wi-Fi facilities. These modem has been installed in principal room, library and in teachers common room. Students are being trained in the computer centre for internet, which is compulsory for the students of the computer centre of the college. Teachers are generally using the internet facilities for the preparation of their classes. The college has a Computer cum Language Laboratory and the most of the students are benefited with this computer laboratory.

The library has also been equipped with three desk top set (all in one), Bar code level printer, Scanner and inverter for digitalization of central library.

31. Financial aid to students:

The government of Assam has launched a very positive and popular programe related to exemption of admission fees for the students whose family falls under "below poverty line". In this context the Government exempted admission fees of the students, whose parents income is less than one Lakh rupees. The total amount exempted by the Government is Rs 4,74,913.00 (Four Lakh seventy four thousand nine hundred and thirteen) only.

The Union body members were exempted from admission and allied fees. The government of Assam (Dept. of WPT & BC) offers scholarship to ST, SC & OBC students.

32. Activities and support from the Alumni Association:

There is a congenial environment in between the association and the authority, therefore the association is always ready to help as and when necessary. The association enthusiastically takes part in Seminar, workshop, awareness programme and socio-cultural activities. Moreover 2 (two) nos. of journal for each department have been subscribed by the Alumni Association of the College.

33. Activities and support from the Parent-Teacher Association:

The parent-teacher association generally sits two times in a year i.e. in the beginning of the semester classes and after declaration of the results. The principal of the college analyzed the last results and keep open for discussion. The parents take part in the discussion the difficulties generally faced by the students in their courses and examinations. The PTA of the college is very co-operative and put forward the positive suggestions for the all round development of the college.

34. Health services:

The first-Aid centre of the college tenders the first-aid treatment in time and serious cases are sent to the nearest health centre as and when felt necessary.

35. Performance in sports activities:

In every session the Students Union Body of the college organizes College Week according to the academic Calendar of Dibrugarh University. Apart from the sports and cultural activities of the college, a group of selected students participated in the Youth Festival organized by Dibrugarh University. Our college Volley ball team has also participated inter district volley ball competition held at Pathalipahar. Even the Sankaradeva college shooting range has organized district level shooting competition in the month of August.
